## March 15. 1881

My dear friend,

I have been very poorly – in fact quite ill – and away from home, or I would have written sooner. I thank God I am better and shall be better and hope to return to my post tomorrow.

I have nothing special to write about, but this and the Love of God. That is unchanging and fathomless. To me, it surpasses all my thoughts and expectations. I enclose a copy of the telegram from Paris about the first meeting there, and an extract from the letter of a staff officer who is there – you will see what is doing by the Lord's goodness there.
